Organisational behaviour is an academic discipline concerned with describing, understanding, predicting and controlling human behaviour in an organizational environment.

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In personality psychology, locus of control is the degree to which people believe that they have control over the outcome of events in their lives, as opposed to external forces beyond their control. Understanding of the concept was developed by Julian B. Rotter in 1954, and has since become an aspect of personality studies. A person's "locus" (plural "loci", Latin for "place" or "location ...
