In an article on Headteacher Update, Dr. Nicola Davies sums it up like this: "The goal of a student with oppositional defiant disorder (ODD) is to gain and maintain control by testing authority to the limit, breaking rules, and provoking and prolonging arguments. In the classroom, this can be distracting for both the teacher and other students."

Strategies for teachers to help improve students' memory skills include: Frequently repeat information and summarize it; Have the student carry an assignment sheet to each class and check that it is correctly filled out

### Instructional Strategies for Teaching Students with ...

Group strategies include asking students to write their answers on dry-erase white boards and showing them to the teacher, asking students to answer questions in unison (choral response), having students give a thumbs up or down if the answer to the question is yes or no — a level palm, if they don't know the answer.

Start out with the teacher using heavily mediated instruction, known as explicit instruction, then slowly begin to let the students acquire the skill, moving towards the goal of student mediated instruction.
