Prior to 2008, all medicolegal death investigations in the state of Mississippi were conducted by county medical examiner investigators. In 2011, the Mississippi State Legislature re-established the State Medical Examiner's Office and replaced the county coroner system with a statewide mixed coroner/State Medical Examiner system (see Miss. Code Ann. § 41-61-51 through § 41-61-79).

An autopsy (also known as a post-mortem examination or necropsy) is the examination of the body of a dead person and is performed primarily to determine the cause of death, to identify or characterize the extent of disease states that the person may have had, or to determine whether a particular medical or surgical treatment has been effective.

A forensic autopsy is used to determine the cause, mode and manner of death. Forensic science involves the application of the sciences to answer questions of interest to the legal system... Medical examiners attempt to determine the time of death, the exact cause of death, and what, if anything, preceded the death, such as a struggle.

Although this is a valid reason for an autopsy, it is not the only reason. The purpose of an autopsy is two-fold: 1) to thoroughly evaluate the presence and extent of human disease in patients and 2) to evaluate the effectiveness of therapeutic procedures for the benefit of patient families, our staff, and the future practice of medicine.

Hospitals – Medical Examiner-Coroner

An autopsy or post mortem is the medical examination of a body after death. A hospital (or non-coronial) autopsy may be performed if the immediate family give their consent. A coroner's autopsy is performed if the coroner or police need information about the cause of death – for example, if the person was murdered or their death was suspicious.

A major problem in forensic autopsy practice is the broad variety of a number of artifacts produced in more advanced states of putrefaction as well as the possible overlapping of putrefactive tissue changes with underlying diseases, the latter being lost at gross inspection of the affected organ. Deaths resulting from blunt force trauma are some of the most common cases encountered by the practicing forensic pathologist. Whereas other forms of traumatic death (eg, gunshot wounds, sharp force injuries) occur under a relatively limited number of circumstances, deaths resulting from blunt force trauma occur in a variety of scenarios.

Autopsy remains the core practice of forensic medicine. The postmortem examiner surveys the body's surface, opens it up with surgical instruments, removes parts for microscopic inspection and toxicological analysis, and makes a report that attempts to reconstruct the cause, manner and mechanism of death.

2. Who is a Medical Examiner? A Medical Examiner is a medical doctor, usually a Forensic Pathologist. The Medical Examiner certifies the cause and manner of death, based on his/her expert opinion following an investigation and medical examination. This examination may include an autopsy and laboratory tests such as toxicology.
