What Is Tantra? — Study Buddhism

In another forum I recently was asked, what exactly was the difference between Sutra and Tantra ? I wrote the following response. It seemed like a worthy question so I am reprinting my response here. The word Sutra is Sanskrit and literally means a thread or line that holds things together. Sutta is the Pali translation of the Sanskrit word Sutra.

Mahayana Buddhism comes in two styles of practice, Sutra and Tantra. Sutra style Buddhism takes a long view of practice as a gradual gaining of positive attitudes and qualities and a gradual shedding of unhelpful qualities and attitudes. Tantra style Buddhism holds that development into a Fully Enlightened Buddha can be speeded up if the practitioner can develop the mental strength and clarity ...

Sutra and Tantra compared – Vividness

Vajrayana teachers compare what they call the gradual, causal, or sutra path of Buddhism to the speedier tantra path. By “sutra” path, they mean following the Precepts, developing meditative concentration, and studying sutras to develop seeds, or causes, of enlightenment.

Transcultural Buddhism: Sutra and Tantra in Buddhism

Buddhist Tantra is ... only some set of methods. This is the approach of the Geluk school, which teaches tantra as a collection of methods for accelerating the path of Mahayana. The other Tibetan schools mostly do not take this approach; they view Tantra as having a different base, path, and result from Sutra.

Tibetan Buddhist Rongzom Chokyi Zangpo (1012–1088) held that the views of sutra such as Madhyamaka were inferior to that of tantra, as Koppl notes: By now we have seen that Rongzom regards the views of the Sutrayana as inferior to those of Mantra, and he underscores his commitment to the purity of all phenomena by criticizing the Madhyamaka objectification of the authentic relative truth.

The fundamental statement of the Mahayana view of reality is in the Prajnaparamita Sutra, which says “form is emptiness, emptiness is form,” and goes on to list as empty all the basic teachings of Hinayana: the rest of the five skandhas, the nidanas, the four noble truths and so forth.

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
