According to him a State loses its immunity in two ways: a State is said to waive its entitlement to immunity when it commits a jus cogens violation and/or a State conduct that violates jus cogens norm is said to fall outside the category of protected State conduct, acta jure imperii²⁶.Such conduct is devoid of legitimacy because it is in conflict with the will of international community.
