Etymology. The personal name Seljuk appears as "Selcük" in Mahmud al-Kashgari's *D?w?n Lugh?t al-Turk* and the *Book of Dede Korkut*. There are different theories about the etymology of Seljuk: selçük, meaning "small flood"; salçuk, meaning "small float"; salç??, meaning "disputant"; According to Cafero?lu (1993), the name was derived from the root sil-in Old Uyghur, meaning "clean".

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
