Haskel and Westlake argue that the recent rise of the intangible economy could play an important role in explaining secular stagnation.Over the past 20 years, there has been a steady rise in the importance of intangible investments relative to tangible investments: by 2013, for every £1 investment in tangible assets, the major developed countries spent £1.10 on intangible assets (Figure below).

How does Canada perform in the intangible economy? Canada's intangible economy is large and growing fast. Between 1976 and 2008, business sector investment in intangibles grew from 5 to 13 percent of economic output in Canada, reaching a total value of \$151 billion. Meanwhile, investments in tangible assets fell from 27 to 16 percent of output.
