Scholars had discussed whether Jesus was a man or a myth or some of each, or if he was an eschatological figure—a herald announcing the end of the world. Early Christians, expecting Jesus imminently and with it the end of history, probably thought it was not necessary to write anything down. Hence the first gospel of Mark was written around 70 AD almost 40 years after his death. The "Lost Years" is the period of Jesus's

The Lost Years Of Jesus

The "lost years of Jesus" concept is usually encountered in esoteric literature (where it at times also refers to his possible post-crucifixion activities) but is not commonly used in scholarly literature. It is assumed that Jesus was probably working as a carpenter in Galilee, at least some of the time with Joseph, from the age of 12 to 29, so the years were not "lost years", and that he died on Calvary.
