They might even be better at thermoregulation than other bumblebees, although this has yet to be investigated. So how did *Bombus kluanensis* remain undiscovered for so long? In a recent assessment of the *Alpinobombus* group, Paul Williams and his colleagues note that the first specimens of this bumblebee species were two queens collected from the Klutlan Glacier in the Yukon, Canada, in 1913.

The word "bumblebee" is a compound of "bumble" + "bee"—"bumble" meaning to hum, buzz, drone, or move ineptly or flounderingly. The generic name *Bombus*, assigned by Pierre André Latreille in 1802, is derived from the Latin word for a buzzing or humming sound, borrowed from Ancient Greek βόμβος (*bómbos*).
