While the exact origins of fried rice are lost to history, it's believed that it was invented sometime during the Sui dynasty (A.D. 589–618), in the city of Yangzhou in eastern Jiangsu province. Yangchow (Yangzhou) fried rice is still the standard by which all other Chinese fried rice dishes are judged: morsels of fluffy rice tossed with roast pork, prawns, scallions, and peas.

Morphological studies of rice phytoliths from the Diaotonghuan archaeological site clearly show the transition from the collection of wild rice to the cultivation of domesticated rice.

### The Origin Rice

The earliest type of rice agriculture used in the Ganges was likely dry cropping, with the plant's water needs provided by monsoonal rains and seasonal flood recession. The earliest irrigated paddy rice in the Ganges is at least the end of the second millennium BC and certainly by the beginning of the Iron Age.

The origin of cultivated rice is thought to be in southwest Asia (Eastern India, Indo China and Southern China) and probably also in

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Africa (Boumas, 1985). The major rice growing regions are found in Asia, Latin America and Africa but the major exporting countries include Thailand, the United States, Vietnam, Pakistan, and India (Boumas, 1988).
