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Theory of Linear Mixed Models. where I is the identity matrix (diagonal matrix of 1s) and  $\sigma^2$  is the residual variance. This structure assumes a homogeneous residual variance for all (conditional) observations and that they are (conditionally) independent. Other structures can be assumed such as compound symmetry or autoregressive.
