Tillich goes further to say that the desire to draw God into the subject-object dichotomy is an "insult" to the divine holiness. Similarly, if God were made into the subject rather than the object of (the Ultimate Subject), then the rest of existing entities then become subjected to the absolute knowledge and scrutiny of God, and the human being is "reified," or made into a mere object.

Tillich pays particular attention to the tension between the concrete and the ultimate in man's religious experience (p.226): polytheism being more concrete than ultimate, an absolute monotheism being more ultimate than concrete, the Trinity being an attempt to formulate a religion that is both concrete and ultimate (p.228).

His Dynamics of Faith (public library) was devoted to a more general readership (nearly unheard of for today's academic theologians) and contains Tillich's development of one of his most lasting concepts: a definition of faith.
