Extreme programming (XP) introduced the practice of expressing requirements in the form of user stories, short descriptions of functionality—told from the perspective of a user—that are valuable to either a user of the software or the customer of the software. The following are typical user stories for a job posting and search site:

Who Writes User Stories in Agile with Scrum ...

A User Story is a note that captures what a user does or needs to do as part of her work. Each User Story consists of a short description written from user's point of view, with natural language. Unlike the traditional requirement capturing, User Story focuses on what the user needs instead of what the system should deliver.

How (and why) to write great User Stories

The user indicates that the software is to perform a search-and-replace in the document. The software responds by requesting the search term and the

replacement text. The user inputs the search term and replacement text and indicates that all occurrences are to be replaced.
