Zipporah or Tzipora (/ ˈ z ɪ p ɔː r ə , z ɪ p ɔː r ə /; Hebrew: צִיפּוֹרָה, Tsipporah, "bird") is mentioned in the Book of Exodus as the wife of Moses, and the daughter of Reuel/Jethro, the priest and prince of Midian. In the Book of Chronicles, two of her grandsons are mentioned: Shebuel, son of Gershom, and Rehabiah, son of Eliezer (1 Chronicles 23:16-17)

This would make the wife of Moses a black woman. But others point out that Moses married Zipporah, the daughter of a priest of Midian named Reuel, also called Jethro (Exodus 2:18-22, 3:1). Midian was a son of Abraham and his 3rd wife Keturah (Genesis 25:1-2). They also claim there were two lands named Cush in the time of Moses.

It is not possible to know FOR SURE from scripture when Moses sent His wife Zipporah, and two sons Gershom (the oldest: Ex 2:22) and Eliezer, back to his father-in-law Jethro. However, nearly all scholars believe it was right after the events in (Ex 4:18-26). We know that originally, they left for Egypt with Moses (Ex 4:18-20).

Zipporah, wife of Moses. The key to understanding that Zipporah was an Israelite is to understand why Moses named his son "Gershom; for he said, I have been a stranger in a strange land". The original very important distinction was lost when two different Hebrew words were translated into English as "stranger" and "strange".

The Cushite wife appears some years later in Moses' story, during the wandering in the desert (you can read about the dispute between Miriam, Aaron and the Cushite wife at Miriam's story.) Zipporah may still be alive at this time, since it was common for high-status Hebrew men to have more than wife.

Wife is singular, and there is no mention of any other wife or wives that Moses had. On the way to Egypt, Zipporah circumcised their son and thus saved her husband's life—Moses had neglected to obey the Lord in this matter, and the Lord would have killed Moses had not Zipporah intervened (Exodus 4:24–26).

Gershom's name was a reminder that Moses was a foreigner and living among foreigners. Later, Zipporah had another son named Eliezer (Exodus 18:4). Later in the book of Exodus, there is a strange passage involving Zipporah. Moses and his wife are traveling to Egypt because God had told Moses to bring the Israelites out of bondage (Exodus 3).
